COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY SENIOR DIRECTS MUSICAL CO-WRITTEN WITH FELLOW STUDENT

Fort Collins, CO – Colorado State University student Andy Steinhauer directs “Caffeine,” a new musical he has written with music by fellow Colorado State student CJ Jeffrey, for his senior capstone thesis project as a Theatre major in the Division of Dance and Theatre in School of the Arts. The play features an all-student cast and creative team and is a fresh, uncompromising look into the love lives of today’s college students.

Performances take place in the Studio Theatre at the University Center for the Arts at 1400 Remington St. one day only on April 12 at 2:30 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. The play contains adult language and situations. Tickets are \$6.50 for the public and \$6 for Colorado State students and may be purchased through the Campus Box Office in person at the Lory Student Center, by phone at (970) 491-4TIX, or online at www.csutix.com. Advance ticket purchase is highly recommended due to the intimate nature of the performance space, though tickets are also available at the door one hour before performances begin if seats remain available.

In the play, everyone in Chris’s circle of friends becomes painfully single overnight through chance, and with the slate wiped clean, new and old feelings are discovered by these college students. Loyalty and true friendship are defined in a real way guiding young love to new heights.

Steinhauer likens his new work to “holding up a mirror as you laugh along with these uniquely familiar characters as they discover their own wants and desires. If you’ve ever been young, you’ll get it. *Caffeine* is a show where you’ll come for the comedy and music, but you’ll be tethered to your seat by the familiar drama.”
