PICK 6 MUSIC DISCOUNT PASS OFFERED BY COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF THE ARTS

Fort Collins, CO – The School of the Arts at Colorado State University will again offer a discount pass for music concerts during its spring Windows of Inspiration season. The Pick 6 Music Discount Pass allows music lovers to select six music concerts – five ensemble or faculty concerts and one special guest artist concert – for the price of five. The \$55 discount pass is available for purchase through the Campus Box Office in person at the Lory Student Center, by phone at (970) 491-4TIX, or online at www.csutix.com. Passes are for sale through March 15.

The Pick 6 Music Discount Pass does not require buyers to select all six concerts at the time of purchase. The pass is a punch card that can be exchanged for tickets as the performance season progresses. It can be exchanged for tickets in person at the Box Office either in advance or the evening of performances, though advance exchange is encouraged to guarantee seat availability.

There are twenty three ensemble and faculty concerts and seven guest artist concerts from which pass holders can select. The ensemble concerts include classical, band, jazz and choral performances, as well as Virtuoso Series concerts by Colorado State faculty followed by Meet the Artist receptions. The guest artists featured in the spring season are the Hugo Wolf String Quartet, pianist Kevin Ayesh, jazz sextet The Russian Dragon Band, the West Point Woodwind Quintet, percussionist Kris Keeton, violinist Boris Garlitsky, and the Borromeo String Quartet.

All events are general admission and take place in either the Griffin Concert Hall in the University Center for the Arts at 1400 Remington Street and in Casavant Hall, which houses the University's world-famous Casavant Freres Organ, in the Music Building on the Oval at Howes and Laurel Streets.
