Project Description

The Bohemian Complex is the second phase of the adaptive reuse of the Old Fort Collins High School. The \$4.7 million Bohemian Complex includes a 37,000 square foot retrofit of the former high school now serving as the 318-seat 'University Theatre'; a 100-seat 'Experimental Studio Theatre'; a 2,400 square foot 'William Runyon Music Hall' in the old gymnasium; and, another 4,500 square feet of production shops, dressing room, green room, audio-visual equipment rooms and other supporting spaces



This winding staircase leads to the control booth from the lower level of the University Theatre. It shows the intersection of the new use and the former high school. The existing hardwood gymnasium floor was refurbished and reused adding interesting detail and reminder of the building's history.

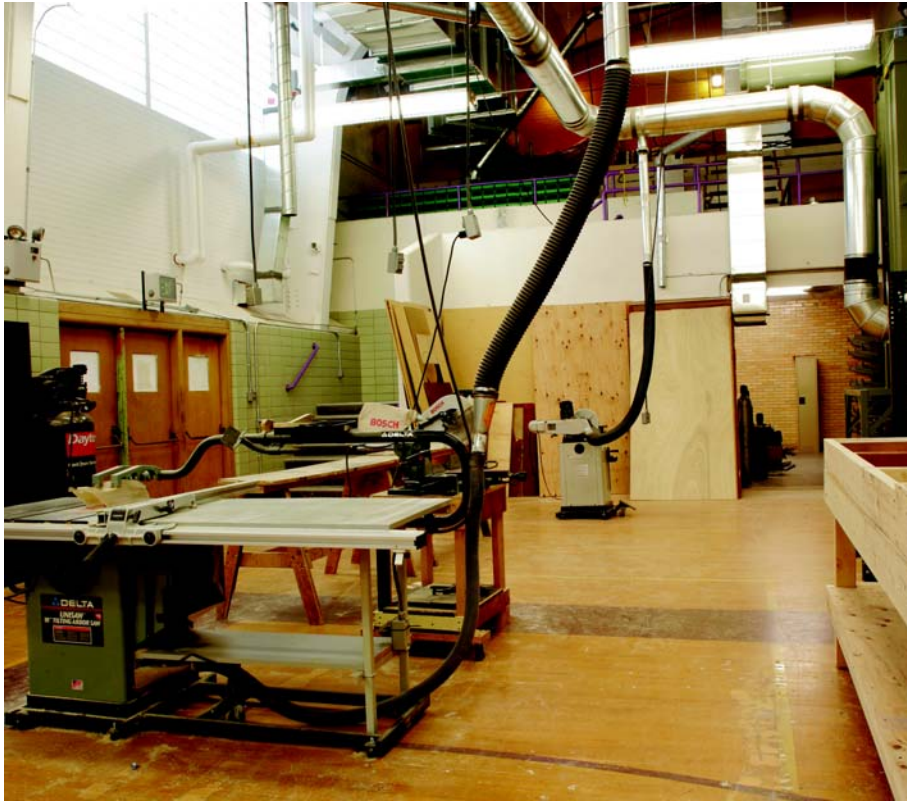
